"Inside the Criminal Mind" interviews industry experts including the FBI, criminologists and psychologists, probing criminal's actions and revealing what they did as a product of who they are, and what they experienced leading to the evil events they created

With exclusive original footage, graphic reconstruction of dramatic events and computer generated technology to recreate the crime scene, "Inside the Criminal Mind" helps the viewer understand what enabled these monsters to move beyond guilt and remorse while taking the horrific actions that grant them their infamy.

"Inside the Criminal Mind" plunges the audience down a terrifying rabbit hole, immersing them in the experience to understand why these monsters do what they do.

Act 1: The definition and description of the specific criminal type featured in that episode. The creation of a psychological profile.

Act 2: The exploration of the specific characteristics that constitute the particular criminal type featured in that episode through a study of the actions and backgrounds of famous criminals.

Act 3: A diagnosis of the criminal type, summarizing the entire episode and completing a profile that helps the audience to understand why these people do what they do, and highlighting the difference between them and the criminal mind.

EPISODE 1: SERIAL KILLERS

Many of the world's most famous murderers have entered the collective cultural consciousness. Through people's morbid fascination, their mass slayings have granted them pop cultural status. This episode examines the psychology and terrifying actions of serial killers; those who kill on multiple occasions to gratify their own desires. Australian Ivan Milat popularly referred to as the backpacker murderer. John Wayne Gacy Jr. the killer who dressed as a clown. The Milwaukee cannibal, Jeffrey Dahmer. British doctor and mass murderer Harold Shipman. The park maniac, Alexander Pichushkin. Scottish child killer, Robert Black. Kidnapper, rapist and necrophyte Ted Bundy and Andrew Cunanan, serial killer and murderer of Gianni Versace. The actions of these men continue to horrify to this day, but by examining their dark and twisted acts we can begin to learn what's inside the serial killer's mind.





EPISODE 2: KIDNAPPING

The unlawful taking of someone and holding them against their will is kidnapping, whether for ransom, political gain, sexual obsession or child custody disputes. This episode examines the mindset human beings with the ability to deprive another of their freedom for their own person gain. We examine Wolfgang Priklopil who kidnapped a ten year old girl, holding her captive in his cellar for ten years. Ariel Castro who abducted three women. The Santa Ana Kidnapping case where Isidro Merdano Garcia kidnapped and raped a fifteen year old girl. Joseg Fritzl who kidnapped and abused his own daughter, holding her captive for twenty years while fathering her children. Stephen Bradley the Australian who kidnapped and eventually murdered Graeme Thorne in an effort to ransom his father's lottery win and the Boko Haram kidnapping of 300 Nigerian school found. By analyzing those who perpetrate these twisted crimes, we can begin to comprehend their psychological mechanisms, allowing us to see inside the kidnapper's mind.



EPISODE 3: CRIME LORDS

Some people are happy to do what they are told but others must call the shots, whatever the cost. This episode focusses on those who lead massive criminal organizations; the crime lord. By exploring the psychology of infamous kingpins and mob bosses, this episode reveals what gives them the ruthless willingness to gamble everything and take lives in their quest for control and power to essentially be "untouchable." El Chapo, the crime lord with the knack for escaping high security prisons. Joaquin Guzman, one of the world's most wanted drug barons and leader of the Sinaloa Cartel. Pablo Escobar, the head of the most notorious drug gang, the Medellin cartel and one time seventh richest man in the world. Bernado Provenzano, "the capo di tutti capi" or boss of bosses in the Sicilian mafia until his arrest in 2006. John Gotti popularly referred to as the "dapper don" and head of America's most influential mafia family and Semion Mogilevich, the pockmarked, heavily obese Ukrainian believed by international law enforcement to be one of the most powerful criminals on earth. Through studying the lives of these powerfully dangerous bosses, we can reveal whether they were born to be bosses or rose from abject poverty to rule as we experience the mechanisms inside the crime lord's mind.



EPISODE 4: DEATH CULT LEADERS

A charismatic personality coupled with fringe beliefs, a messianic complex and an appetite for violence are but a few of the common traits shared amongst death cult leaders. This episode we examine Charles Manson whose followers famously committed several gruesome murders in the late 1960s. David Koresh, the leader of the Branch Davidians who built an "army of god," stockpiling weapons in preparation for the apocalypse. Self proclaimed messiah, Jim Jones who led more than 900 men, women and children in mass suicide. Shoko Asaha ra, founder of Japanese cult Aum Shinrikyo and mastermind of lethal sarin gas attacks, killing thirteen people and injuring thousands more. The self-proclaimed prophet Marshall Herff Applewhite, leader of the Raelians, instigator of another mass suicide and Warren Jeffs, leader of the Fundamentalist Church of Jesus Christ and Latter Day Saints who found his way onto the FBI's ten most wanted for marrying off under-age girls to his disci ples. While examining the psychology of history's most notorious, we'll unravel the creation of their philosophies that lead to the death and suffering of not just outside victims but their own followers as the we journey inside the death cult leader's mind.
